## General Business

## Planning Update

- Developments**

G Walls noted that there are no current planning issues and Flower Power is yet to act on its DA. NSW Ports will be engaging on the “Sydney Plan” (which also includes the Statewide Policy for Industrial Lands) released by the Department of Planning, which replaces the Six Cities Region Plan.

## Committee Member Updates

### 6. Tenant Developments

G De Santis noted that there were no updates.

B Beudeker advised that a hardstand upgrade was completed at Site D in December which will limit dust and improve the surface for vehicles.

### 7. Council Updates

S Jordan advised that there are no current engagement issues within the Enfield industrial vicinity. Current projects that are open for community engagement can be found at <https://haveyoursay.cbcity.nsw.gov.au/> and include:

- Reclassification of land within Campsie Town Centre.
- Proposed parking changes in Canterbury and Earlwood.

J Inglese advised that Transport for NSW issued a discussion paper related to workshops for the reclassification of roads. The aim is to submit an application to reclassify Norfolk, Wentworth and Bellfrog Roads to regional roads which provides additional grant money. The Local Traffic Forum agreed in principle to turn Mayvic Street into a one-way street and consultation will commence in due course.

B Beudeker advised that Strathfield Council has undertaken work developing the [Greenacre Frog Ponds](#) located on Bellfrog Street. The Frog and Tadpole Society (FATS) of NSW has been undertaking volunteer work at the frog pond, which has been successful with Green & Golden Bell Frog population recovery at the Greenacre Frog Pond.

## HSE Update

### 8. Summary of Complaints/Incidents

B Beudeker advised that there have been no complaints or incidents in the last three months. The annual Independent Environmental Audit (which is a requirement of NSW Ports Project Approval MP 05\_147 condition 4.1) was recently submitted to the Department. The audit findings were positive with no non-compliances identified and five observations observed. Three observations have been closed and the two open observations relate to housekeeping (updating plans) and new warehouse tenants. The report can be found on the NSW Ports website at:

B Beudeker advised that no frogs were identified at a recent frog survey, however, invasive frog species were identified. Ponds will be drained and dried out over summer in preparation for the next breeding season in hope that it will attract frogs from Greenacre Frog ponds.
